Completion of the NJDEP Urban & Community Forestry (NJUCF) Program's education and training requirements is one step toward attaining or maintaining NJUCF Annual Accreditation. NJUCF Accredited communities have access to grant funding for the implementation of their NJUCF approved Community Forestry Management Plan (CFMP), and a basis to reduce or eliminate liability associated with local tree care programs and shade tree commissions in accordance with the [New Jersey Shade Tree and Community Forestry Assistance Act \(N.J.S.A. 13: 1L-17.1 et. seq.\)](#). For more details on the NJUCF program, accreditation, and development of a Community Forestry Management Plan go to www.communityforestry.nj.gov.

If you are unsure of whether to attend **CEU Sessions**, and/or **NJUCF Community Representative (Core) Training**, please reach out to your municipal or county shade tree representative to ask about your community's needs for attaining/maintaining NJUCF Annual Accreditation.

NJ Urban & Community Forestry Program Continuing Education Units (CEUs)

- NJUCF CEUs provide a permanent record for the state and local governments regarding the education and training of the volunteers and employees engaged in urban and community forestry. NJUCF CEUs build a community's urban forestry knowledge bank and provide more advanced learning opportunities to inform and guide the practice of urban and community forestry throughout the state.
- **NJUCF Accreditation** requires a minimum of eight (8) CEUs between at least two (2) individuals per municipality or county be earned annually. Any individual, whether they have attended core training or not, can earn CEUs on behalf their municipality/county.

NJUCF CEU Sessions at the SHADE TREE FEDERATION CONFERENCE:

- Attendance at the general and concurrent sessions provide maximum ten **(10) CEUs for two days, or five (5) CEUs per day**, per person.
- You must list the* Municipality or County you intend to support on your conference registration form.
***NJUCF CEUs may not be applied to multiple municipal records**
- Attendees must stay for the entire session, complete any and all required paperwork, and scan into/out of the room in accordance with conference host/usher instructions to receive CEUs for each session (**no exceptions**).

NJ Urban & Community Forestry Program Community Representative (CORE) Training

- NJUCF Community Representative (CORE) Training is an introduction to urban and community forestry in New Jersey covering the basics from science, the law, management, and funding of trees and community forest programs throughout the state. This Training is for individuals interested and engaged in the stewardship of their urban and community forest and the trees that populate it; Shade Tree Commissioners, board or committee members, municipal or county employees, and anyone with an interest in trees, forestry, environment/ecology, and community sustainability.
- **NJUCF Accreditation** requires annual retention of at least two (2) NJUCF Core Trained Community Representatives per municipality/county.
 - o One (1) person must be a municipal/county employee, and one (1) person must be a shade tree commission member, board member, or volunteer from the municipality/county working with the tree resource.
 - An elected official may be substituted in either the core trained employee or volunteer role.

GENERAL SESSION SPEAKERS

Dr. Nina Bassuk has been a professor and program leader of the Urban Horticulture Institute at Cornell University for the past 40 years. She is on the Board of Directors of the New York State Urban Forestry Council and is co-author of "Trees in the Urban Landscape," a text for landscape architects and horticultural practitioners on establishing trees in disturbed and urban landscapes. In addition, Dr. Bassuk has authored over 100 papers on the physiological problems of plants growing in urban environments, including improved plant selections for difficult sites, soil modification including the development of 'CU-Structural Soil' and improved transplanting technology. She works closely with municipalities to help implement best practices in urban forestry management.

Dr. Jason Grabosky is a professor at Rutgers Univ. / NJ Agricultural Experiment Station. He is the John and Eleanor Kuser Faculty Scholar in Urban and Community Forestry. Jason teaches classes in arboriculture, urban forestry, and general forest ecology topics.

He maintains an extension program in urban forestry and conducts research in a series of areas generally associated with trees and built environments.

Paul Johnson is the Senior Director of Urban and Community Forestry for the Sustainable Forestry Initiative.

Paul is an International Society of Arboriculture (ISA) Board Certified Master Arborist, Municipal Specialist, and is Tree Risk Assessment, Texas Oak Wilt, and Wildfire Risk Reduction Qualified. He is also a Society of American Foresters Certified Forester. Paul has been recognized as a True Professional of Arboriculture by ISA and received the Leah MacSwords Current Achievement Award for Communications from NASF.

He is Past President of the ISA Board of Directors and he graduated from Oklahoma State University with a degree in Forestry. He has been a state U&CF program leader, radio talk show host, newspaper columnist, Extension horticulturist, University adjunct instructor, and plant health care specialist.

Paul believes that #TreesAreKey to healthier, happier, safer communities.

Dr. Nicole Davi is a Professor and the Chairperson of the Environmental Science Department at William Paterson University. She is also an Adjunct Senior Research Scientist at the Tree-Ring Laboratory at Columbia University's Lamont-Doherty Earth Observatory.

Davi is a paleoclimate scientist focused on the development and interpretation of tree-ring records and has a background in physical geography. Her research focuses on understanding climate variability, dynamics and forcing on time scales ranging from years to millennia, as well as understanding the impacts of climate variability on ecosystems and people. Davi has developed tree-ring records that have documented the history of late Holocene drought across Central Asia as well as warming across the northern latitudes, particularly in the circum-Arctic. Currently, she is building a field program focused on Northeast coastal forests with the aim of reconstructing tropical cyclone frequency and severity recorded in these unique maritime forests. She has authored/co-authored 59 peer-reviewed papers in high-impact journals and she has authored many more published abstracts, many with students as lead authors or co-authors.

During her career she has been awarded more than \$3 million through federal and private funding agencies. Davi also has several projects that focus on improving science literacy for undergraduate and also for public audiences. Davi often collaborates with artists to explore new and compelling ways to communicate the excitement of scientific explorations with diverse audiences.

Walt Warriner is a Consulting Arborist & Urban Forester based in Hawaii and California, but is willing to work anywhere in America to preserve our urban forests. For over 35 years he has worked with government agencies, developers, contractors, law firms, insurance agencies and individual property owners. His education includes Agriculture and Business Accounting from the University of Hawaii and Landscape Architecture from UCLA. He is a Certified Urban Forester, Certified Arborist and Municipal Specialist, Pesticide Applicator, Pest Control Advisor, Qualified Tree Risk Assessor and a Qualified Tree Risk Appraiser. He is a founding member of the Municipal Forestry Institute where he taught leadership in urban forestry from 2006 – 2021.

Mary Charlotte Gitlin (Paul Cowie & Associates) is a consulting ecologist and urban forester. She is a New Jersey Licensed Tree Expert (#715), ISA Certified Arborist (NJ-1333A), and holds a Bachelor of Science from Rutgers University in Ecology, Evolution, and Natural Resources.

Mary Charlotte passionately believes that a properly and proactively managed urban forest is critical to maintaining livable communities as the climate continues to rapidly change. She endeavors to collaborate with professionals in different disciplines and think outside the box to maximize the benefits of trees and associated vegetation.

Lisa Simms has a Bachelor's Degree in Environmental Science from Rutgers University and 25+ years' experience in urban and community forestry and nonprofit management. Ms. Simms has been the Executive Director of the New Jersey Tree Foundation since its inception in 1997. She develops and directs all the Foundation programs, and runs the fee-for-service Green Streets Program which hires men under parole supervision as a tree planting crew. Ms. Simms provides technical assistance and educational programs to other forestry groups, educators and community organizations. Prior to directing the NJ Tree Foundation, Ms. Simms was the Greening Program Director for the Greater Newark Conservancy which targeted low-income neighborhoods of Newark in the beautification and revitalization of their community.

Lindsay Campbell attended Princeton University, where she studied public policy and environmental studies.

Lindsay Campbell joined the U.S. Forest Service soon after Sept. 11. Immediately she hit the ground running working on the Living Memorials Project, an agency initiative that gave grants to communities to use trees to create living memorials in remembrance of the tragedy.

Today the research social scientist is working at the New York City Urban Field Station and is a doctoral candidate in geography at Rutgers University while also competing on the U.S. National Team for fencing where she is ranked third in the country.

Pam Zipse is the Outreach Coordinator for Rutgers Urban Forestry Program and works to connect the personnel and programs at Rutgers to the community of forestry consultants and shade tree program volunteers in NJ who can utilize the information, contacts, and tools developed through these programs in the management of their local shade tree resources. Pam is a NJ Licensed Tree Expert and serves on the Board of the NJ Tree Foundation, the NJ Board of Tree Experts, the NJ Community Forestry Council, and is currently President of the NJ Shade Tree Federation.

Wayne Dubin holds a B.S. Degree in Plant Science from Cook College, Rutgers University. After graduation, he went to work as an Account Executive for Gruntal & Co. In January 1989, he joined the F. A. Bartlett Tree Expert Co. in Westchester County, New York as an Arborist Representative. In 1993 he was promoted and transferred to Local Manager in Warren, New Jersey and subsequently became District Manager and then Assistant Division Manager for the Metropolitan Division in April 1999.

Wayne currently serves as Vice-President and Division Manager for Bartlett's Metro-West Division (New Jersey and New York, excluding Long Island) managing eight offices and thirty-five Arborist Representatives. He has a successful record of accomplishment in sales and sales management for forty years.

Mr. Dubin is Vice-Chair of the NJ Community Forestry Council, Vice-Chair of the ANSI A300 Committee for Tree Care Standards and is a Past President of the NJ Arborists, Chapter ISA as well as the NJ Shade Tree Federation. He is a NJ Licensed Tree Expert.

Ben Graziano joined State Street Associates in 2018 after 15 years in politics. Ben began his career in the district office of U.S. Representative Robert E. Andrews, where he handled constituent and veterans' issues. In 2009, Mr. Graziano began working as the director of Legislative Affairs for then-Assemblyman Jack Conners. Mr. Graziano joined the Assembly Majority Office (AMO) in January of 2012 as a policy analyst. During his seven-year tenure at the AMO, Mr. Graziano staffed several important Assembly committees and helped to craft several key legislative initiatives. Mr. Graziano holds a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science from Mount Saint Mary's College and a Master's in Public Administration from Rutgers University. He was awarded the State of NJ Commendation Medal for his service assisting New Jersey's National Guard and Veteran community.

Tom Purtell is a NJ Licensed Tree Expert retained by Richview Consulting. His primary role is part time municipal arborist for the Townships of Bloomfield and Montclair since 2018. He has recently conducted full tree canopy inventories for Maplewood, Springfield, and Verona Townships. He also assists with assignments in Madison, Mt. Olive, Glen Ridge & South Orange. Tom is currently the vice president of the NJ Arborists Chapters of the International Society of Arboriculture.

One of the past projects Tom is most proud of was assisting in the regular monitoring of the Freedom Tower tree farm in Millstone NJ when employed by Bartlett Tree Experts for 20 years. He will give you a glimpse of the regular issues township DPW departments face when residents contact them with concerns. It is up to all of us to make good planting decisions that will not repeat mistakes of the past.

Kathleen Kyle is a fifth year PhD candidate in the Lockwood Lab at Rutgers University, New Brunswick in the Ecology and Evolution graduate program. She completed her BS in the same department at Rutgers and began to work on environmental DNA (eDNA) projects in the Lockwood Lab. Ms. Kyle's dissertation research focuses on pushing the bounds of current eDNA surveying methods to develop protocols that more inclusively survey species of concern in various terrestrial niches.

She grew up on a farm in central New Jersey and this upbringing helped foster her interest in the environment and learning how ecological systems function.

Robert Wells is a NJ Licensed Tree Expert, a Board-Certified Master Arborist and a Registered Consulting Arborist. With his son David Wells, Robert is the owner of Wells Tree & Landscape Inc. in Princeton, now in its 50th year of operation. He has a BS from Cook College, Rutgers, and earned a Master's in Environmental Studies from the University of Pennsylvania. He was the Associate Director of Arboricultural Outreach at Morris Arboretum from 2007 until 2020 and was instrumental in the development of The School of Arboriculture. His passion and advocacy for trees in New Jersey are expressed in the consulting work with which he is now engaged.
